- **Section 508** – (section508.gov)
 - Section 508 requires that Federal agencies' electronic and information technology is accessible to people with disabilities. This site allows you to access resources for understanding and implementing the requirements of section 508.
- **WebAIM & WAVE Validator** – (www.webaim.org & wave.webaim.org)
 - These are great resources for all things accessibility. WebAIM gives the specifics of section 508 requirements in easy to understand terms, helpful practices, hints, and tips to making accessible web content without hindering the design process. The WAVE tool provides an easy way to check a web page for basic web accessibility evaluation.
- **Color Scheme Designer**– (colorshemesdesigner.com)
 - This is a great color accessibility reference tool that lets you see what your color scheme would look like with various types of color blindness.

 - Another color accessibility tool, which allows you to view your current computer screen as various types of color blind users would.
